WAYS & MEANS

The Ways and Means Chairman initiates and directs activities to raise funds to enable your chapter to take advantage of opportunities for its growth and experience.

As Ways and Means Chairman, you are:

- responsible for researching and presenting to your chapter projects which will raise funds for your chapter treasury.
- to appoint all necessary committees to carry out projects chosen by your chapter.
- to serve as chairman or appoint an appropriate member to be responsible for each activity.
- to keep adequate records of expenses and income, contacts, ideas, etc. for all projects.

Helpful Hints

- Watch your newspaper for ideas from other organizations. What works for them might possibly work for you, too.
- Many chapters elect to conduct one major event as opposed to several small revenue projects throughout the year. This is a decision that should be made by your committee and WM at the first of the year, and presented to the members for their approval.
- Your chapter might elect to conduct a special project sometime during the year to raise funds for your own chapter's personal use, i.e., help defray initial new membership fees, pay city council, state and 1C dues, provide funds for subscriptions to your state newspaper, or reduce expenses of members attending conventions.

Three major areas you must first consider are pre-planning, cooperation, and publicity.

- A. A. Pre-planning: Examine your budget, set a goal, and completely investigate all details.
- B. B. Cooperation: Select a project that fits your chapter and community. Be prepared and enthusiastic, if you are sold on the idea, you'll sell it to others. Avoid community conflicts when scheduling.
- C. Publicity: Work with your chapter's Publicity Chairperson to help get the word out. Some ideas on publicity are to contact radio and TV stations for public service spots, purchase a newspaper ad, request the use of marquees at banks and fast food restaurants, and make posters and flyers for malls and businesses. Talk about your coming event to everyone you come in contact with.

When going over ideas for the year, consult with your chapter's Philanthropic Chairperson so money can be raised for philanthropic projects, as well as the chapter's operating budget.

There are many ways to raise money for your chapter. Below is a list of a few projects that have been successful. You may also find more ideas

FUND RAISERS

We are here today to give you some ideas on how to raise money for your Chapter. There are many things that you can do where you are not charging your members. What we are going to give you today are just suggestions and you may have to adjust them to your area.

REST STOPS: Number 1 on the list would be to work the Rest Stops. This is a very good money maker and you get in new money. These Rest Stops come under the Department of Transportation in each County and each County is run separately. You would need to contact the office in your area to see how and when you put in for one. It might be that you would have to together with the lodge or another Chapter if you can't get enough of your Chapter members to fill all the spots.

All you are required to provide is coffee; however most people would like a cookie or some other goodie. You might be able to get bakery goods from your local supermarket. Just ask them for their day old goodies to serve at the Rest Stop. This is also a way to get our name out before the public. We have for you the phone numbers for information on the various Rest Stops.

HAND OUT FLYERS...

BAZAARS: In some areas these are not very profitable. Instead of calling it a Bazaar, you can call it an Arts and Craft Fair and rent tables to outside vendors. Then your Chapter can have a table and also work the snack bar. You can serve coffee and donuts in the morning and serve soup and hot dogs for lunch. This does bring in outside people and your Chapter members are not making something and then buying it back. Advertising is a big item for this event and you can't have too much.

In many areas Banks will pay you to come in and provide coffee and cookies for their customers. You can talk to the banks in your area and see if this is something they would like to do.

INSERTS: Within your Chapter there are several things that you can do. If you send out a Newsletter, you can put in a silly letter whereby the members can fill out and send back with a donation. If they don't want to fill it out, they can just send in a donation. This is especially good for those members

that live a ways away and cannot get to Chapter. They feel that they are still participating. Here are a few suggestions and since these were done a few years back, you might want to change the amounts:

- 1. Family Tree
- 2. Special Benefit Brunch
- 3. Silly Tax

I have copies of these that you can take with you. These are just suggestions but it will give you an idea.

CHINESE AUCTIONS; You can have auctions such as a Chinese Auction. This is where you start the bidding say at \$1.00, the next person bids \$1.25. Then they put in \$.25. As each person bids, they put in just the difference between the bid and what they bid. These can be a lot of fun and nobody really spends a lot of money.

You can have a pie party where you can sell tickets. The people would come and play cards and then have a piece of pie. If you don't want to sell tickets, then you can charge for the pie. You can have non-members come to this and perhaps you would get people interested enough to join.

RAFFLES: Then there are raffles. You can have a raffle every other month. No one minds paying \$1.00 per ticket. Each time you can have someone different in charge. That way you can have different items.

If you want to have only 1 raffle during the year, make sure that it is a nice prize that people would want to win. Then sell tickets outside your Chapter.

You can approach your Masonic Lodge and see if they would like you to cater a meal for them, or take care of the refreshments after their Installation. In many instances this has helped get new members.

In many areas you can help with inventory at local stores. This is something that you would have to check out.

RUMMAGE SALES: This is a good way to raise money and meet new people. Someone is always ready to find a good bargain. Maybe during the last hour, you can sell grocery bags for \$1.00 each and everything they can

get in the bag is theirs. This will help get rid of items so that you don't have to haul them away.

CAR WASH: This is a way to get the kids involved. Maybe you can do this in connection with Jobies, Rainbow or Demolay. Ask a local gas station if you can have one at their place. This will not only benefit you, but it will give the station advertising.

BREAKFAST: Perhaps you could have an Easter breakfast on the Saturday before Easter. You can sell tickets to the breakfast and then have the children's picture taken with the Easter Bunny. You can charge for the picture if you want.

GIFT WRAPPING: Maybe you can get a booth at your local mall and gift wrap Christmas gifts for people. You not only can make money but you can make our Order known to the public. If you don't have a mall in your area, perhaps you could contact your local department store or drug store and see if you can have a corner to do this.

There are many more things that your can do depending on your area. You can have a HAUNTED HOUSE, BAKE SALE or SPONSOR A SPORTING EVENT. Each one will have to check out what would work in their area.
